Prompts:

1. act as: "Include any popular blogger or author you want to mimic their writing style of"
2. Include micro and macro semantics as applicable.
3. Target audience: "age", "location", "language proficiency", "interests", "psychographics", "demographics".
4. Include relevant keywords mentioned in the later prompts. Employ semantic keywords, including lexical, query semantics, synonymy, antonymy, hypernymy, hyponymy, meronymy, holonymy, and troponymy.
5. Provide real-world examples and analogies whenever possible without making them repetitive. Always make sure to not include offensive analogies that don't contribute to the overall relevancy.
6. Tone: "Describe it in detail"
7. The format of the post should be in small paragraphs, varying sentences, and include bullet points whenever necessary.
8. The purpose of the article is to inform the audience about the topic without losing humor.
9. Don't forget to consider different opinions. If something contradictory appears, include both of them for me to judge.
10. Scope: "Define the range of the topic"
11. Terminology: "Mention any industry-specific inclusion or exclusions"
12. Statistics: Encourage it to include stats, but be careful with the numbers. DO FACT-CHECK EACH REFERENCE.
13. Call-to-Action: "Mention any call-to-actions that you want it to include"
14. Sensitivity: "Mention any topics that need to be tread carefully."
